

A LETTER FROM THE DIRECTOR OF NEWSIES:

The story of newsies all started with some kids. "Newsie" was a term used for the children who sold newspapers on the streets at the turn of the century. In New York City, newsies were thought of as little business people. However, two newspaper publishers, Joseph Pulitzer of The World and William Randolph Hearst of The Journal, controlled the prices of the papers. The newsies often had to choose between food and a bed to sleep in at night. The musical **NEWSIES** is based on the real-life Newsboys' Strike of 1899. It was not until 1938 that Congress passed the Fair Labor Standards Act, a law that prohibited the employment children vounger than 16 and placed limits on the employment of kids between

16 and 18 years old. At that time, many people argued that child labor helped children by teaching them a trade. When in reality, their jobs as children kept them from going to school and improving their futures.






